

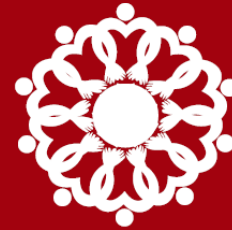

Killings, Abductions Spike

With 18 persons killed, Zamfara State this week has the highest number of casualties of killing and abductions by bandits that has

continued unabated in the country.

Niger state recorded eight and Kebbi five according to the verified media reports of atrocities by our monitors from February 18 – 23, 2022.

While the number of those injured in Zamfara and Kebbi state was not known, 14 were injured in Niger and five abducted in five each in Kaduna and Niger states.
